




Yep I know Kev we will never rear her! She was really pointing out her two sore fingers??!


Top marks to Billy Slater, Cameron Smith & Johnno Thurstan Go the Maroons!

I was a little disappointed that there wasn't a bit of coal in the prizes but I am very happy with what I did get!


