OUT OF BOUNDS

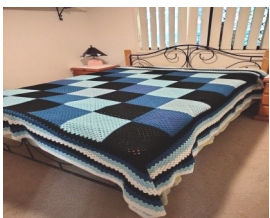
I went oob's on 1/10 with some help of the rocks that were on the fairway! Not happy Jan!

FROM THE BUNKER!

4th Fairway Reconstruction Over view of Project

A 6,200 square metre area of the fairway will be cleared & levelled. Top dressing sand will be spread & roll out turf laid over the top.

The Majority of the funding will provided by a grant of \$55,000 from the State Government

Active Game Day Projects Fund.

Preliminary work starts on Monday 29th August with the poisoning of existing grass & removal of old sprinkler heads.

Monday 19th September to Monday 17th October

Fairway completely closed.

The first week will involve excavation machinery on site and other restrictions to ensure safety may be necessary. The next 3 weeks will be for the turf to establish itself. Impact for players & competitions. Players to go from the 3rd Green to the ladies 5th Tee. Note the first 40 metres of the fairway will not be getting renovated so Carts and Walkers will be able to traverse this area.

Players will play 16 holes or 8 only. Cards will not be handicapped during this period.

Volunteers Required Cart Shed Relocation

The removal of the cart shed from Hervey Bay Golf Club is now planned for

Wednesday 7 & Thursday 8 September.

The project will involve dismantling the shed and transporting it to our club for storage until funds become available for a concrete slab, certification & other associated works.

Starting time is 7.30am & if you have drills and bits suitable to remove roof or wall screws please bring them with you.

It is expected that you wear work shoes & have gloves for handling metal sheets with sharp edges.

It is also recommended that you wear long pants & have your own

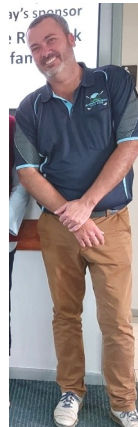

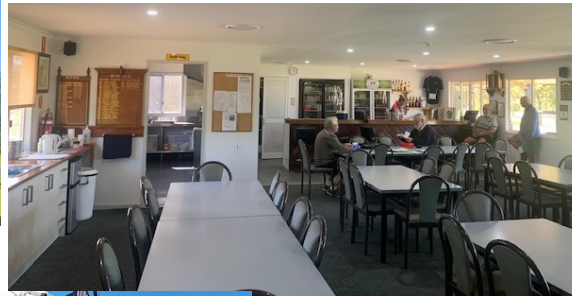

The Club House is soon to be painted, & a new flag pole attached with the Australian flag waving proudly atop it! The paint job will just cap the look of what is now a very good looking building!

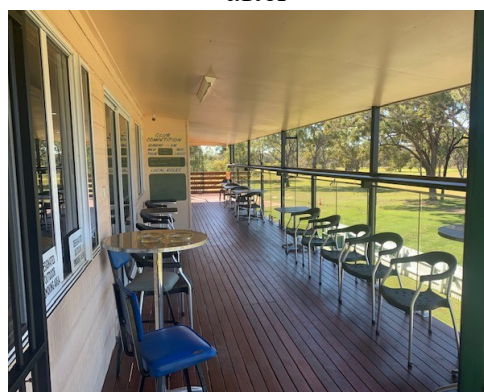
BUT WAIT THERE'S MORE!

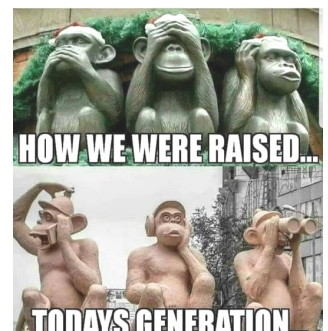


Winners are Grinners!

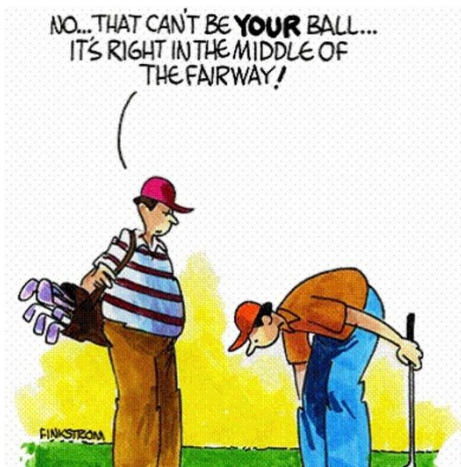




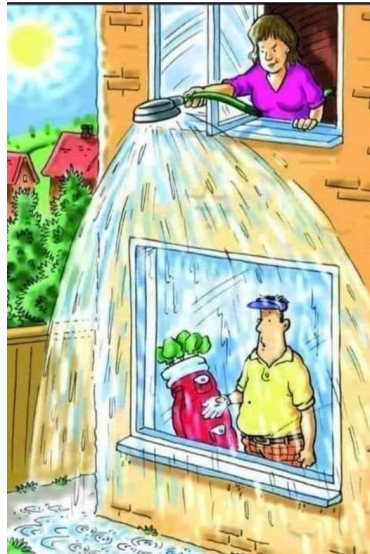
MELBOURNE CUP

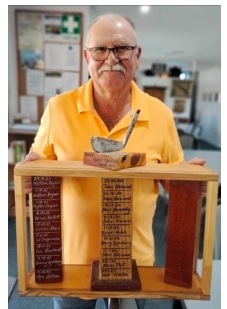

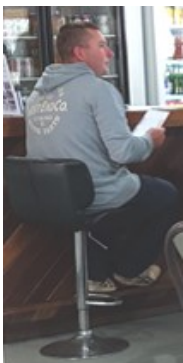

Justification for Price Increases.

Our club has consistently maintained lower costs for its members over the past several years.

The last increase in prices was on April 1 of this year.

That increase was primarily on the sales of alcohol related products. Your committee has recently investigated cost structures of similar clubs to ours and found that our prices are lower overall.

Over the past 12 months the club has experienced greatly increased fuel costs. We are all aware that the price of fuel has risen. However, the amount of fuel used to maintain the course has also risen. The abundant rainfall over this period has produced thriving and verdant fairways and roughs and lush greens, thus necessitating the mowing of these much more frequently.

Cost and usage of fuel has increased by more than 150% in the past twelve months.

In addition to the added fuel costs, the club is having to expend greater amounts on fertilisers, fungicides, chemicals and poisons. We all agree that the greens and their surrounds are in excellent condition requiring the use of more and more fertilisers, fungicides, chemicals and poisons to achieve and maintain this.

Cost and usage of fertilisers, fungicides, chemicals and poisons has risen by more than 4%.

The return on the sale of beer, wines and spirits has decreased by more than 10% over this same period.

This decrease is mainly due to increasing costs and the excise duty charged.

It is obvious that the price increases adopted in April were not sufficient to alleviate this.

Also, the cost of wages for the club's employees will rise by 4.6% on October 1 as result of a decision from the Fair Work Commission.

It is for these reasons that the committee are proposing the following price structure. This new price structure has been updated in line with the current CPI of 6%.
